

# The Booke of Common prayer and administration of the Sacraments.

## The order where Morning and Eueing prayer shall bee vsed and said.

The Morning and Eueing prayer shall be vsed in the accustomed place of the Church, Chappel, or Chancel, except it shall be otherwise determined by the Ordinary of the place: And the Chauncels shall remaine as they haue done in times past.

And here is to be noted, that the Minister at the time of the Communion, and at all other times, in his ministracion, shall vse such Ornaments in the Church, as were in vse by authority of Parliament in the second yeere of the reigne of King Edward the sixt, according to the Act of Parliament, in that case made & provided.

## An order for Morning prayer dayly throughout the yeere.

At the beginning both of Morning Prayer, and likewise of Eueing Prayer, the Minister shall reade with a lowd voyce, some one of these Sentences of the Scriptures that follow: And then hee shall say that which is written after the said sentences.

Ezek. 18.  
21. 22.



What time soeuer a sinner doeth repent him of his sinne from the bottoome of his heart, I will put all his wickednesse out of my remembrance, saith the Lord.

I doe know mine owne wickednesse, and my sinne is alway against me.

Psal. 51. 3.

Turne thy face away from our sinnes, O Lord and blot out all our offences.

Psal. 51. 9.

A sorrowfull spirit is a sacrifice to God: despise not O Lord humble and contrite hearts.

Renew your hearts and not your garments, and turne to the Lord your God, because he is gentle and mercifull, he is patient, and of much mercy, and such a one that is sorrie for your afflictions.

Dearly beloved brethren, the Scripture mooueth vs in sundry places, to acknowledge and confesse our manifold sinnes and wickednesse, and that wee should not dissemble nor cloake them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father: but confesse them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart, to the end that wee may obtaine forgiveness of the same by his infinite goodnesse and mercy. And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sinnes before God: yet ought we most chiefly so doe, when we assemble & meete together, to render thanks for the great benefits, that wee haue receiued at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to heare his most holy word, & to aske those things which be requisite & necessary, a wel) for the body as the soule. Wherefore I pray and beseech you as many as be heere present, to accompany mee with a pure heart and humble voyce into the Throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me.

A General confession to be said of the whole Congregation after the Minister, kneeling.

Almighty and most mercifull Father, we haue erred and strayed from thy wayes like lost sheepe, we haue followed too much the deuices and desires of our own hearts: we haue offended against thy holy Lawes: wee haue left vndone those things which wee ought to haue done, and we haue done those things which wee ought not to haue done, and there is no health in vs: but thou, O Lord, haue mercy vpon vs miserable offenders. Spare thou them, O God, which confesse their faults: Restore thou them that be penitent, according to thy promises declared vnto mankinde in Christ Iesu our Lord: and grant, O most mercifull Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter liue a godly, righteous and sober life, to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

The absolution or remission of sinnes to be pronounced by the Minister alone.

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Iesus Christ, which desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turne from his wickednes, and liue, and hath giuen power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare & pronounce to his people being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sinnes, he pardoneth & absolveth all them which truly repent, and vnfeignedly beleue his holy Gospel. Wherefore we beseech him to grant vs true repentance and his holy Spirit, that those things may please him which wee doe at this present, & that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to his eternall joy, through Iesus Christ our Lord.

The people shall answer.

Amen.

Then shall the Minister begin the Lords prayer with a lowd voyce.

Our Father which art in heauen, hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdome come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heauen. Giue vs this day our daily bread. And forgive vs our trespases, as wee forgive them that trespasse against vs. And leaue vs not into temptation. But deliuer vs from euill. Amen.

Then likewise he shall say.

O Lord open thou our lips.

And our mouth shall shew forth thy praise.

O God make speede to saue vs.

Morning prayer.

Praise ye the Lord.

Then shall be said or sung this Psalme following. Come, let vs sing unto the Lord: let vs heartily reioyce in the strength of our saluation. Let vs come before his presence with thanksgiuings: and shew our selues glad in him with Psalmes. For the Lord is a great God: and a great King aboue all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth: and the strength of the hills is also. The sea is his, and hee made it: and his hands prepared the vpp land.

Come, let vs worship and fall downe: and kneele before the Lord our maker. For he is the Lord our God: and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheepe of his hands.

To day if wee will heare his voyce, harden not your hearts: as in the prouocation, and as in the day of temptation in the wilderness.

When your fathers tempted mee: proued me, and saw my woakes.

Forty yeeres long was I grieved with this generation, & said: it is a people that doe erre in their hearts, for they haue not knowen my wayes.

Unto whom I sweare in my wrath: that they should not enter into my rest.

Then shall follow certaine Psalmes in order, as they be appointed in a Table made for that purpose, except there be proper Psalmes appointed for that day. And at the end of euery Psalme throughout the yere, and likewise in the end of Benedicims, Benedicite, Magnificat, and Nunc dimittis shall be repeated.

Glozy be to the Father, and to the Sonne &c. As it was in the beginning, &c.

Then shall be read two Lessons distinctly with a loud voyce, that the people may heare. The first of the old Testament, The second of the New, like as they be appointed in the Kalender, except there be proper Lessons assigned for that day: The Minister that readeth the Lesson, standing, and turning him so, as hee may best be heard of all such as be present. And before euery Lesson, the Minister shall say thus: The 1. 2. 3. or 4. Chapter of Genesis, or Exodus, Mathew, Marke, or other like, as is appointed in the Kalender. And in the end of euery Chapter hee shall say, Here endeth such a Chapter of such a Booke.

And (to the end the people may the better heare, in such places where they doe sing, there shall the Lesson be sung in a plaine tune, after the manner of distinct reading: and likewise the Epistle and Gospel.

After the first lesson, shall follow Te Deum in English daily through the whole yere.

W e praise thee, O God: we knowledg thee to be the Lord.

All the earth doeth worship thee: the Father euerlasting.

To thee all Angels cry a loud: the heauens and all the powers therein.

To the Cherubin & Seraphim: continually doe cry. Holy, holy, holy: Lord God of Sabbaoth.

Heauen & earth are full of thy maiesty: of thy glozy. The glorious company of the Apostles: praise thee. The goodly fellowship of the Prophets: praise thee. The noble armie of Martyrs: praise thee.

The holy Church throughout all the world: doeth knowledg thee. The Father: of an infinite Maiesty, Who honourable: true, and onely Sonne, Also the holy Ghost: the Comforter,

Thou art the King of glozy: O Christ. Thou art the euerlasting Sonne: of the Father.

When thou tookest vpon thee to deliuer man: thou diddest not abhorre the virgins wombe.

When thou haddest overcome the sharpenesse of death: thou diddest open the Kingdome of heauen to all beleeuers.

Thou sittest on the right hand of God: in the glozy of the Father.

We beleue that thou shalt come: to be our Iudge. Wee therefore pray thee helpe thy seruants: whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood.

Make them to bee numbred with thy Saints: in glozy euerlasting.

O Lord saue thy people: and blesse thine inheritance. Gouverne them: and life them vpon for euer.

Day by day: wee magnifie thee. And we worship thy Name: euer world without end. Touchsafe, O Lord: to keepe vs this day without sin.

O Lord haue mercy vpon vs: haue mercy vpon vs. O Lord let thy mercy lighten vpon vs: as our trust is in thee.

O Lord in thee haue I trusted: let me neuer bee confounded.

As hee spake by the mouth of his holy Prophets: which haue been since the world began.

That wee should be saved from our enemies: and from the hands of all that hate vs.

To performe the mercy promised to our forefathers: and to remember his holy covenant.

To performe the oath which he swore to our forefather Abraham, that he would giue vs.

That we, being deliuered out of the hands of our enemies: might serue him without feare.

In holinesse and righteousnesse before him: all the dayes of our life.

And thou childe, shalt be called the Prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt goe before the face of the Lord, to prepare his wayes.

To giue knowledge of saluation vnto his people: for the remission of their finnes.

Through the tender mercy of our God: whereby the day-spring from on high hath visited vs.

To giue light to them that sit in darkenesse, and in the shadow of death: and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried, he descended into hell, the third day he rose againe from the dead, he ascended into heauen, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty: from thence shall he come to iudge the quicke and the dead. I beleene in the holy Ghost, the holy Catholique Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of finnes, the resurrection of the body, and the life euermourning. Amen.

¶ And after that, these prayers following, as well at Euening prayer, as at Morning prayer, all devoutly kneeling The Minister first pronouncing with a lowd voyce.

**O** Lord our heavenly Father, Almighty and euermourning God, which hast safely brought vs to the beginning of this day, defend vs in the same with thy mighty power, and grant that this day we fall into no sinne, neither runne into any kinde of danger, but that all our doings may be approved by thy governance, to doe alwayes that is righteous in thy sight, through Iesus Christ our Lord. Then a Lesson of the Old Testament, as is appointed likewise in the Kalender, except there bee proper Lessons appointed for that day. After that *Magnificat*, in English, as followeth.

Sing vnto the Lord a new song: for he hath done marvellous things.

Hee hath remembered his mercy and trueth toward the house of Israel: and all the ends of the world haue seene the salvation of our God.

Show your selues ioyfull vnto the Lord, all yee hands: sing, reioyce, and giue thanks.

Praise the Lord vpon the harpe: sing to the harpe with a Psalme of thanksgiving.

With Trumpets also and Shewmes: Show your selues ioyfull before the Lord the King.

Let the Sea make a noise, and all that therein is: the round world, and they that dwell therein.

Let the floods clap their hands, and let the hills be ioyfull together before the Lord: for hee is come to iudge the earth.

*Cantate Domino.*

With righteousness shall he iudge the world: and the people with equity.

Glorie be to the Father, and to the Sonne: and to the holy Ghost.

As it was in the beginning, is now and euer shall be: world without end. Amen.

¶ Then a Lesson of the new Testament, and after that, *Nunc dimittis* in English, as followeth.

¶ The second Collect for peace.

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all iust workes doe proceed: giue vnto thy seruants that peace which the world cannot giue, that both our hearts may be set to obey thy Commandments, and also that by thee we being defended from the feare of our enemies, may passe our time in rest and quietnesse, through the merits of Iesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

¶ The third Collect for ayde against all perils.

Lighten our darkenesse, we beseech thee, O Lord, and by thy great mercy defend vs from all perils, and dangers of this night, for the loue of thy onely Sonne our Saviour Iesus Christ, Amen.

¶ In the Feasts of Christmas, the Epiphany, S. Marthias, Easter, the Ascension, Pentecost, S. Iohn Baptist, S. Iames, S. Bartholomew, S. Matthew, S. Simon and Iude, S. Andrew, and Trinitie Sunday, shall be sung or said immediatly after *Benedictus*, this confession of our Christian faith,

## The Letanie.

**W**holoever will bee saued: before all things it is necessary that he hold the Catholike faith. Which faith except every one do keepe whole and undivided: without doubt he shall perish everlastingly.

And the Catholike faith is this: that wee worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unitie.

Neither confounding the persons: nor dividing the substance.

For there is one person of the Father, another of the Sonne: and another of the holy Ghost.

But the Godhead of the Father, of the Sonne, and of the holy Ghost, is all one: the glory equal, the Paternall coeternall.

Such as the Father is, such is the Sonne: and such is the holy Ghost.

The Father uncreate, the Sonne uncreate; and the holy Ghost uncreate.

The Father incomprehensible, the Sonne incomprehensible: and the holy Ghost incomprehensible.

The Father eternal, the Sonne eternal; and the holy Ghost eternal.

And yet they are not three eternals: but one eternall.

As also there be not three incomprehensibles, nor three uncreates: but one uncreate, & one incomprehensible.

So likewise the Father is Almighty, the Sonne Almighty: and the holy Ghost Almighty.

And yet they are not three Almighties: but one Almighty.

So the Father is God, the Sonne is God: and the holy Ghost is God.

And yet they are not three Gods: but one God.

So likewise the Father is Lord, the Sonne Lord: and the holy Ghost Lord.

And yet not three Lords: but one Lord.

For like as we be compelled by the Christian verity: to acknowledge every perso by himself to be God & Lord.

So are wee forbidden by the Catholike Religion: to say there be three Gods, or three Lords.

The Father is made of none: neither created, nor begotten.

The Sonne is of the Father alone: not made, nor created, but begotten.

The holy Ghost is of the Father, & of the Son: neither made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers, one Son, not three Sons: one holy Ghost, not three holy ghosts.

And in this Trinity none is afore, or after other: none is greater or lesse then another.

But the whole three persons be coeternall together: and coequal.

So that in all things as is aforesaid: the Unitie in Trinity, and the Trinity in Unitie is to be worshipped.

He therefore that will be saued: must thus thinke of the Trinity.

Furthermore it is necessary to everlasting saluation: that hee also beleue rightly in the incarnation of our Lord Iesus Christ.

For the right faith is, that we beleue and confesse: that our Lord Iesus Christ, the Sonne of God, is God and man.

God of the substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds: and man of the substance of his mother, borne in the world.

Perfect God and perfect man: of a reasonable soule, and humane flesh subsisting.

Equal to the Father as touching his Godhead: and inferiour to the Father touching his manhood.

Who although he be God and man: yet hee is not two but one Christ.

One, not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh: but by taking of the manhood into God.

One altogether, not by confusion of substance: but by unitie of person.

For as the reasonable soule and flesh is one man: so God and man is one Christ.

Who suffered for our saluation, descended into hell: rose againe the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, he sitteth on the right hand of the Father, God Almighty: from whence he shall come to iudge the quicke and the dead.

At whose coming all men shall rise againe with their bodies: and shall giue account for their owne works.

And they that haue done good shall goe into life everlasting: and they that haue done euill, into everlasting fire.

This is the Catholike faith: which except a man beleue faithfully, he cannot be saued.

Glorie be to the Father, and to the Sc.

A Prayer containing the duty of every true Christian.



**D**ost mighty God, mercifull and loving Father, I wretched sinner come unto thee in the Name of thy dearely beloved Sonne Iesus Christ, my onely Saviour and Redeemer: and most humbly beseech thee for his sake to be mercifull unto mee, and to cast all my sinnes out of thy sight and remembrance, through the merits of his bloody death and passion.

Downe upon mee (O Lord) thy holy Spirit of wholesome grace: governe and leade me by thy holy Word, that it may be a lantern unto my feete, and a light unto my steps. Shew thy mercy upon mee, and so lighten the naturall blindness and darknesse of my heart through thy grace, that I may daily be renewed by the same Spirit and grace: by the which (O Lord) purge the grossenes of my hearing and understanding, that I may profitably reade, heare, and understand thy word and heavenly will, beleue and practise the same in my life and conversation, and evermore hold fast that blessed hope of everlasting life.

Fortifie and kill all vice mine, that my life may expresse my faith in thee: mercifullly heare the humble supplication of thy servant, and grant me thy peace at all my daies: graciously pardon mine iniquities, and defend me in all dangers of body, goods, and name: but chiefly my soule, against all assaults, temptations, accusations, subtil baits and sleights of that olde enemy of mankind, Satan that poisoning ypon, ever seeking whom he may deuoure.

And here (O Lord) I prostrate, with most humble mind crave thy diuine Blessing, to be mercifull unto the vniuersall Church of thy Sonne Christ: And especially according to my bounden duty beseech thee for his sake to blesse, save and defend the principall member thereof, thy seruant our most deare and loueraigne Lord King Charles, increase in his royall heart true faith, godly zeale, and loue of the same: And grant him victorie ouer all his enemies, a long, prosperous and honourable life vpon earth, a blessed end, and life everlasting.

Whereouer, O Lord, grant unto his maiesties most honourable countsellours, and euery other member of this thy Church of England, that they and we in our severall callings, may truly & godly serue thee: Plant in our hearts true feare and honour of thy Name, obedience to our Prince, and loue to our neighbours: Increase in vs true faith and Religion: Replenish our minds with all goodnesse, and of thy great mercy keepe vs in the same till the end of our liues: Giue vnto vs a godly zeale in prayer, true humilitie in prosperitie, perfect patience in aduersitie, and continuall ioy in the holy Ghost.

And lastly, I commend vnto thy fatherly protection, all that thou hast giuen me, as wife, children, and seruants: Aide me, O Lord, that I may governe, nourish, and bring them up in thy feare and seruice. And forasmuch as in this world I must alwayes be at warre and strife, not with one sort of enemies, but with an infinite number: not onely with flesh and blood, but with the deuill which is the prince of darknesse, and with wicked men, execrators of his most damnable will: grant me therefore thy grace, that being armed with thy defence, I may stand in this battell with an invincible constancie against all corruption, which I am compassed with on euery side, untill such time I ha-

ving ended the combate which during this life I must sustaine, in the end I may attaine to thy heavenly rest, which is prepared for me and all thine Elect, through Christ our Lord and onely Saviour. Amen.

¶ A generall confession of sinnes to be layd euery morning.



**O** Almighty God our heauenly Father, I confesse and acknowledge, that I am a miserable and a wretched sinner, and haue manifold wayes most grieuously transgressed thy most godly commandments, through wicked thoughts, vngodly lusts, sinfull wordes and deedes committed at my whole life. In sinne am I borne and conceived, & there is no goodnes in me, in as much as if thou shouldst enter into thy narrow iudgement with me, iudging me according vnto the same, I were neuer able to suffer & abide it, but must needs perish, and be damned for ever: So little helpe, comfort, or succour is there either in me, or in any other creature. Only this is my comfort (O heauenly Father) that thou dost not spare thy only beaue beloved Sonne, but dost give him vp vnto the most bitter, and most vile and honorous death of the crosse for me, that he might so pay the ransom for my sinnes, satisfie thy iudgement, fill & pacifie thy wrath, reconcile me againe vnto thee, and purchase me thy grace and fauour, and everlasting life. Wherefore through the merit of his most bitter death and passion, and through his innocent blood-shedding, I beseech thee, O heauenly Father, that thou wilt vouchsafe to be gracious and mercifull vnto me, to forgive and pardon mee of all my sinnes, to lighten my heart with thy holy Spirit, to reueto, confirme, & strengthen me with a right & a perfect faith, and to inflame me in loue toward thee and my neighbour, that I may henceforth with a willing and glad heart, walke as it becometh mee, in thy most godly Commandements, and so glorifie and praise thee eternally. And also that I may with a free conscience & quiet heart, in all manner of temptations, afflictions, & necessities, & euery in the very pang of death, cry boldly and merily vnto thee, and say, I beleue in God the Father Almighty, maker of heauen and earth, and in Iesus Christ, &c. But, O Lord God heauenly Father, to comfort myselfe in affliction and temptation w<sup>th</sup> these Articles of the Christian faith, it is not in my power, for faith is thy gift: and for as much as thou wilt be prayed vnto, and called vpon for: so I come vnto thee, to pray and beseech thee, both for that and for all other my necessities, even as thy beaue beloved Sonne our Honourable Iesus Christ himselfe hath taught vs. And from the

very bottome of my heart I cry and say, Our Father which art in heauen, hallowed be thy Name, &c.

Prayers to be said in the Morning.

**O** Mercifull Lord God, heauenly Father, I render most high lauds, praise, and thanks vnto thee, that thou hast preserved mee both this night, & all the times and dayes of my life hitherto vnder thy protection, and hast suffered mee to live vntill this present houre. And I beseech thee heartily, that thou wilt vouchsafe to receiue me this day, and the residue of my whole life, from henceforth into thy tuition, ruling and governing me with thy holy Spirit, that all manner of vicioussnesse, of misbeliefe, infidelitie and of carnall lusts and affections may be utterly chased and driuen out of my heart, and that I may be instructed and saved both body and soule through a right and perfect faith, and so walke in the light of thy most godly truth, to thy glory and praise, and to the pacifie and furtherance of my neighbour, through Iesus Christ our Lord and Honour. Amen.

**A**s possible thanks that we are able, wee render vnto thee, O Lord Iesus Christ, for that thou hast visited this night past, to be prosperous vnto vs: and wee beseech thee likewise to prosper all this same day vnto vs for thy glory, and for the health of our soule, and that thou which art the true Light, not knowing any going downe, and which art the Sonne eternall, giving life, food & gladnesse vnto all things, vouchsafe to shine vnto our mindes, that wee may not any where stumble to fall into any sinne, but may through thy good guiding and conducting, come to the life everlasting. Amen.

**O** Lord Iesus Christ, which art the true Sonne of the world, evermore arising, & neuer going downe, which by thy most wholesome appearing & sight, dost bring forth, preserve, nourish and refresh all things as well that are in heauen, as also that are on earth: wee beseech thee mercifullly & fauourably to shine vnto our hearts, that the night and darknesse of sinnes, and the mists of errors on every side driuen away, thou brightly shining within our hearts, we may all our life (pace go without any stumbling or offence, and may decently and seemly walke (as in the day time) being pure and cleane from the washes of darknesse, and abounding in all good works which God hath prepared for vs to walke in, which with the Father and with the holy Ghost liuest and reignest for ever and ever. Amen.

## Godly prayers.

**O** God and Lord Jesus Christ, thou knowest, pea, and hast also taught vs how great the infirmity and weaknesse of man is, and how certaine a thing it is that it can nothing do without thy godly helpe. If man trust to himselfe, it cannot be auoided, but that he must euen hearelong, and fall into a thousand wrongs and mischiefs. O our Father, haue thou pitie and compassion vpon the weaknesse of vs thy children, bee thou present and ready to helpe vs, alwayes shewing thy mercie vpon vs, and prospering whatsoever we godly goe about, so that thou giuing vs light, wee may see what things are truly good indeed: thou encouraging vs, we may haue an earnest desire to the same: and thou being our guide, wee may come where to obtaine them: for we haue nothing but mistrust in our selues, do feele and count our selues full and wholly vnto thee alone, which worketh all things in all creatures, to thy honour and glory. So be it.

### A prayer against temptation.

**O** Lord Jesus Christ, the onely way and fence of our mortall state, our onely hope, our onely saluation, our glory, and our triumph, who in the flesh (which thou hadst for our onely cause taken vpon thee) diddest suffer thy selfe to be tempted of Satan, and who onely and alone of all men didst vterly overcome and vanquish sin, death, the world, the deuill, and all the kingdoms of hell: and whatsoever thou hast so overcome, for our behoofe it is that thou hast overcome it: neither hadst thou any will to haue any of thy seruants to keepe battell, or fight with any of the foresaid euils, but of purpose to reward vs with a crowne of the more glory for it. And to the intent that thou mightest liberate ouer from Satans tyranny, giue vnto vs thy little sheepe the strength and vertue of thy Spirit, that being in our own selues weak and feeble, and in thee strong and valiant, we may withstand and overcome all assaults of the deuill, so that our ghostly enemy may not glory on vs, but being conquered through thee, wee may giue thanks to thy mercie, which neuer leaue them destitute that put their trust in thee, who liuest and reignest God for euer without end. Amen.

### A prayer for the obtaining of wisdom.

**Wisdom 9.** **O** Son of our fathers, and Lord of mercie, thou that hast made all things with thy word, and ordaind man through thy wisdom, that he should haue dominion ouer the creatures which thou hast made, that he should order the world according to equitie and righteousness, and execute iudgement with a true heart: giue mee wisdom, which is euer about thy seate, and put me not out from among thy children: for I thy seruant and some of thine handmaid, am a feeble person, of a short time, and too young to the vnderstanding of thy iudgement and salues: yea, though a man bee neuer so perfect among the children of men, yet if thy wisdom bee not with him, he shall be nothing worth. O send thy wisdom out of thy holy heauens, and from the throne of thy Majesty, that she may be with me, and labour with me, that I may know what is accep-

table in thy sight, for shee knoweth and vnderstandeth all things, and shee shall conduct me right soberly in thy works, and preserve me in her power, so shall my works be acceptable. Amen.

### A prayer against worldly carelesse.

**O** Most deare and tender Father, our defender and nourisher, inue vs with thy grace, that wee may cast off the great blindnesse of our mindes, and carelesse of worldly things, & may put our whole studie and care in keeping of thy holy Law, and that we may labour and trauaile for our necessities in this life, like the birds of the ayre, and the Lillies of the field without care. For thou hast promised to be carefull for vs, and hast commanded that vpon thee wee should cast all our care: which kindest and reigneless world without end. Amen.

### A prayer necessary for all persons.

**O** Mercifull God, I a wretched sinner acknowledge myselfe bound to keepe thy holy comandments, but yet unable to performe them, & to bee accepted for inll without the righteousnesse of Jesus Christ thy onely Sonne, who hath perfectly fulfilled thy Law, so iustifie all men that beleue and trust in him. Therefore grant me grace, I beseech thee, to be occupied in doing of good works, which thou commandest in holy Scripture, all the dayes of my life, to thy glory, and yet to trust onely in thy mercie, and in Christs merits, to bee purged from my finnes, and not in my good works, bee they neuer so many. Giue mee grace to loue thy holy word feruently, to search the Scriptures diligently, to reade them humbly, to vnderstand them truly, to liue after them effectually. Ouer my life so, O Lord, that it may be alway acceptable vnto thee. Giue mee grace not to reioyce in any thing that displeaseth thee, but euermore to delight in those things that please thee, be they neuer so contrary to my desires. Teach me so to pray, that my petitions may bee graciously heard of thee. Keepe me vpright among diuersities of opinions and iudgements in the world, that I neuer departe from thy truth taught in holy Scripture. In prosperitie, O Lord, saue me that I be not proud. In aduersity help me, that I neither despaire, nor blaspheme thy holy name, but taking it patiently, to giue thee thanks, and trust to bee deliuered after thy pleasure. When I happen to fall into sinne through frailtie, I beseech thee to worke true repentance in my heart, that I may bee soie without desperation, trust in thy mercie without presumption, that I may amend my life, and become truly religious without hypocritie, lowly in heart without faining, faithfull and true without deceit, merrie without lightnesse, sad without mistrust, sober without stouthe, content with mine owne without couetousnesse, to rell my neighbour his faults charitably without dissimulation, to instruct my household in thy lawes truly, to obey our King, and all gouernours vnder him vnfeignedly, to receiue all lawes and common ordinaunces (which disagree not from thy holy word) obediently, to pay euery man that which I owe vnto him truly, to backbite no man, nor slander my neighbour secretly, and to abhorre all vice, louing all goodnesse earnestly. O Lord grant me thus to bee, for thy glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

### A prayer for patience in trouble.

**H**ow hast thou (O Lord) humbled and plucked me to thee, for thou art angry w me, but not without my deserving. Certainely I haue sinned, Lord, I confesse it: I will not denie it: but oh my God, pardon my trespasses, release my debts, render not thy grace againe vnto mee, stoppe my wounds, for I am all to plagues and

and beaten: yet Lord, this notwithstanding, I abide patiently, & giue mine attendance on thee, continually waiting for reliefe at thy hand, and that not without skill, for I haue receiued a token of thy fauour and grace toward me, I meane thy word of promise concerning Christ, who for me was offered on the Crosse for a ransome, a sacrifice and price for my sins: wherefore according to that thy promise, defend me Lord by thy right hand, and giue a gracious eare to my requests, for all mans stayes are but vaine. Beat downe therefore mine enemies thine owne selfe with thy power, which art my onely aider and protector, O Lord God Almighty. Amen.

### ¶ A prayer to be said at night going to bed.

O Mercifull Lord God heauenly Father, whether we sleepe or wake, liue or die, wee are alwayes thine. Wherefore I beseech thee heartily, that thou wilt vouchsafe to take care and charge of mee, and not to suffer me to perish in the woakes of darkenesse, but to kindle the light of thy countenance in my heart, that thy godly knowledge may daily increase in me through a right & pure faith, and that I may alwayes be found to walke and liue after thy will and pleasure, through Iesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

### ¶ A prayer to be said at the houre of death.

O Lord Iesus, which art the only health of all men liuing, and the euerlasting life of them which die in faith: I wretched sinner giue and submit my selfe wholly vnto thy most blessed will. And being sure that the thing cannot perish which is committed vnto thy mercy, willingly now I leaue this fraile & wicked flesh in hope of the resurrection: which in better wise shall be reuoked it to me againe. I beseech thee, most mercifull Lord Iesus Christ, that thou wilt by thy grace make strong my soule against all temptation, and that thou

wilt couer and defend me with the buckler of thy mercy against all the assaults of the deuil. I see & know ledge that there is in my selfe no hope of saluation, but all my confidence, hope, and trust is in thy most mercifull goodnesse. I haue no merits nor good woakes which I may alledge before thee. Of times and euill woakes (alas) I see a great heape, but through thy mercy I trust to be in the number of them to whom thou wilt not impute their finnes, but take and accept me for righteous and iust, and to be the inheritor of euerlasting life. Thou mercifull Lord, waite for me for my sake, thou diddest suffer both hunger and thirst for my sake, thou diddest preach and teach, thou diddest pray and fast for my sake, thou diddest all good woakes and deedes for my sake, thou sufferedst most grieuous paines and tormentes for my sake. And finally, thou gapest thy most precious body to die, and thy blood to be shed on the Crosse for my sake. Now most mercifull Saviour, let all these things profit mee, which thou freely hast giuen me, that hast giuen thy selfe for me. Let thy blood cleanse and wash away the spots and foulnesse of my finnes. Let thy righteounesse hide and couer mine vnrightheounesse, Let the merits of thy passion and blood be the satisfaction for my finnes. Giue me Lord, thy grace, that my faith and saluation in thy blood wauer not in mee, but bee euer firme and constant, that the hope of thy mercy and life euerlasting neuer decay in mee, that charitie waxe not cold in me. Finally, that the weakenesse of my flesh be not overcome with the feare of death. Grant me, mercifull Saviour, that when death hath shut vp the eyes of my body, yet that the eyes of my soule may still behold and looke vpon thee, that when death hath taken away the vse of my tongue and speech, yet that my heart may cry and say vnto thee, In manus tuas Domine, commendo spiritum meum, (that is to say) O Lord, into thy hands I giue and commit my soule: Domine Iesu, accipe spiritum meum: Lord Iesu, receiue my soule vnto thee. Amen.
